Aggravated by the COVID-19 pandemic, **plastic waste** has become a major component of the global environmental challenge. Negatively contributing to pollution, biodiversity loss and climate change, the ubiquity of plastic represents a triple emergency that must be tackled with effective and innovative initiatives. The UN Environment Programme (UNEP) has estimated the negative spill-over effects of plastic waste on fisheries, tourism and maritime transport alone be \$40 billion per year. Furthermore, up to 1 million people die each year in developing countries because of diseases related to mismanaged plastic waste. Plastic has undoubtedly become a leading driver of **Eco-Poverty**, a new concept marking the environmental dimensions of global poverty, and often the most vulnerable communities disproportionally bear the impact of ecological degradation triggered by plastic pollution.

All sectors of global society – public and private, in particular the Cooperation and Development community – share equal, yet differentiated, **responsibilities** towards addressing this grand societal challenge.

With the help of international field-experts, academia and practitioners, the workshop sets the ambitious goal of exploring the role of *Environmental Mainstreaming Approach* in current policies and practices to address the "pandemic" of plastic.
